EVMTAA (E) : Hi, Alfred. Could you tell us about your job?

Alfred (A): I work in The Jane Goodall Institute, which is an international NGO that focuses on environmental conservation. My job duties are diverse, including project development, webpage design and education.

E: As you are working in a global organization, do you need to go on business trips or collaborate with colleagues in other places?

A: I do. I have travelled to other countries to help organize environmental education activities. I also liaise with colleagues in other branches very often for project coordination.

E: Could you name a special project that you have participated in?
